ONLINE RECORD KEEPING — ZBOOKS

ZBooks is the online 4-H record keeping software. This online software is identical to the pdf forms used for many years—meaning 4-H'ers and families now have the option to choose which format you feel more comfortable using. Both are evaluated using the same rubric and set of standards. Some features of ZBooks include: mobile friendly, internet-based, unlimited amount of entries until final report is submitted, permanent record is included, and the live online support chat feature. and/or participate in a 4-H leadership activity such as a camp counselor, daycamp, babysitting clinic, etc.
