YOUTH FOR THE QUALITY CARE OF ANIMALS (YQCA)

Required for youth planning to sell livestock in the Rooks County Free Fair 4-H/FFA Livestock Sale, livestock exhibitors at the Kansas State Fair and Kansas Junior Livestock Show. The final instructor-led training will be held June 9 at 6:30 pm at the Rooks County Fairgrounds, 4-H Building. If this date doesn't work you can utilize the online training at YQCA - Youth for the Quality Care of Animals. The fee will be \$12 per youth. 4-H/FFA LIVESTOCK TAGGING REQUIREMENTS

All livestock (beef, goats, sheep and swine) must be tagged with a 4-H tag, herd tag, and/or tattoo for identification purposes and turned into the Phillips-Rooks Extension District by May 1 to be eligible for the Phillips County Fair and Rooks County Free Fair. If an animal loses it's tag, please contact the Phillips-Rooks Extension District Office so the animal can be retagged.


