STATE 4-H HORSE JUDGING CONTEST

January 23, 2026 at EquiFest of Kansas in Topeka. Two contests are available- an open contest and a 4-H contest. Kansas 4-H members age 9-18 are invited to participate in the 4-H contest, and may also participate in the open contest. Youth of any age are eligible to participate in the open contest hosted by Kansas Quarter Horse Association. Cost to enter the 4-H contest is \$25. Registration for the open contest is \$15. Coaches should register teams and individuals here—Horse Judging Entry Form | EquiFest of Kansas . Early-bird registration closes January 2; late registration is available until January 9. 4-H DOG JUDGES & LEADER TRAINING

When enrolling please select "Pay By Check" to have your \$15 enrollment fee covered by the Phillips County 4-H Council or Rooks County 4-H Council depending on which county you are enrolling in. DO NOT SELECT WAIVER WHEN ENROLLING! Those members that are interested in participating in the Shooting Sports project (Air Rifles) must be enrolled by November 1. Don't forget to enroll in the Leadership project if you are a 4-H member and age 12 by January 1.


